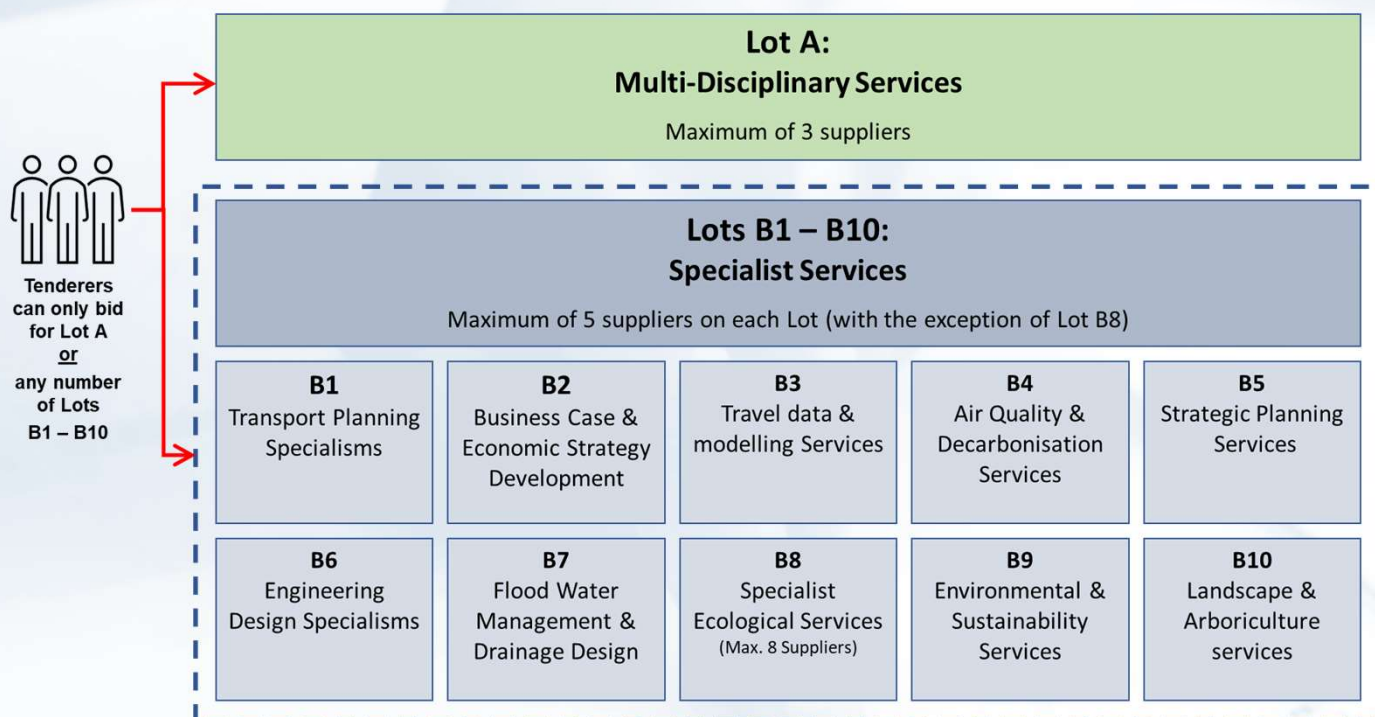
Place, Connectivity and Infrastructure (PCI) Professional Services Framework 2022 – 2026

Introduction and Framework Structure

Hampshire County Council have procured and awarded a multi-supplier Framework for the provision of the wide range of professional services associated with the delivery of transportation, civil engineering and infrastructure projects.

This is a 4-year multi-supplier Framework, with the structure split into two main parts over 11 lots:

- **Lot A: Multidisciplinary Services** – consists of three suppliers who will deliver a range of (typically) large scale, complex and multidisciplinary services.
- **Lot B1 – B10: Specialist Services** – these 10 lots will provide specialist services across multiple disciplines, as shown below.

Building strong relationships which align with our values:

Framework Geographical Coverage



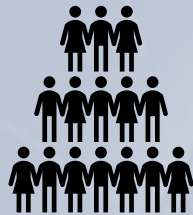
Lot A: Whole of England

Framework tender and award methods

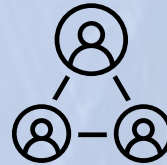
Mini competition



This is a 'traditional' procurement method where Framework suppliers bid against each other for call-offs. This can be used by the Client where they choose and can be assessed on a combination of price and quality.

Mini-competitions must be used for the first stage for all commissions with an award value over £100k (for Lot A) or £30k (for Lot B1-B10)

Direct award on a rotation basis



Direct award on rotation can be used (if the Client chooses) for call-offs with a value of up to £100k (for Lot A) or £30k (for Lots B1-B10).

For this method, the suppliers are directly offered work based on whose turn it is on the rotation for the individual Lot.

If the Client does not want to use this method, then they can use the Mini-Competition tender procedure.

Direct award for continuity purposes



Direct award for continuity purposes can be used by the Client where the Framework supplier has delivered previous stage/s of the same project, and the Client wants to keep them in place for any subsequent stages for efficiency and continuity.

This direct award method can only be used for projects which were initially procured via the PCI Framework.

Managing Performance

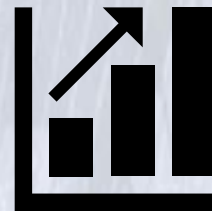
Performance will be managed on the Framework by using Key Performance Indicators (KPI), which will be available for Clients to complete on the PCI Framework web portal. Clients will be given access to this once they have signed up the Framework. As this is a web-based portal, no software will need to be downloaded.

The KPI will assess the following three areas for all projects:



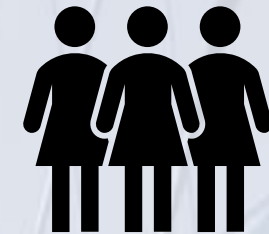
Organisational Performance

Measures whether the quality of service that the *Consultant's* organisation provides.



Project Performance

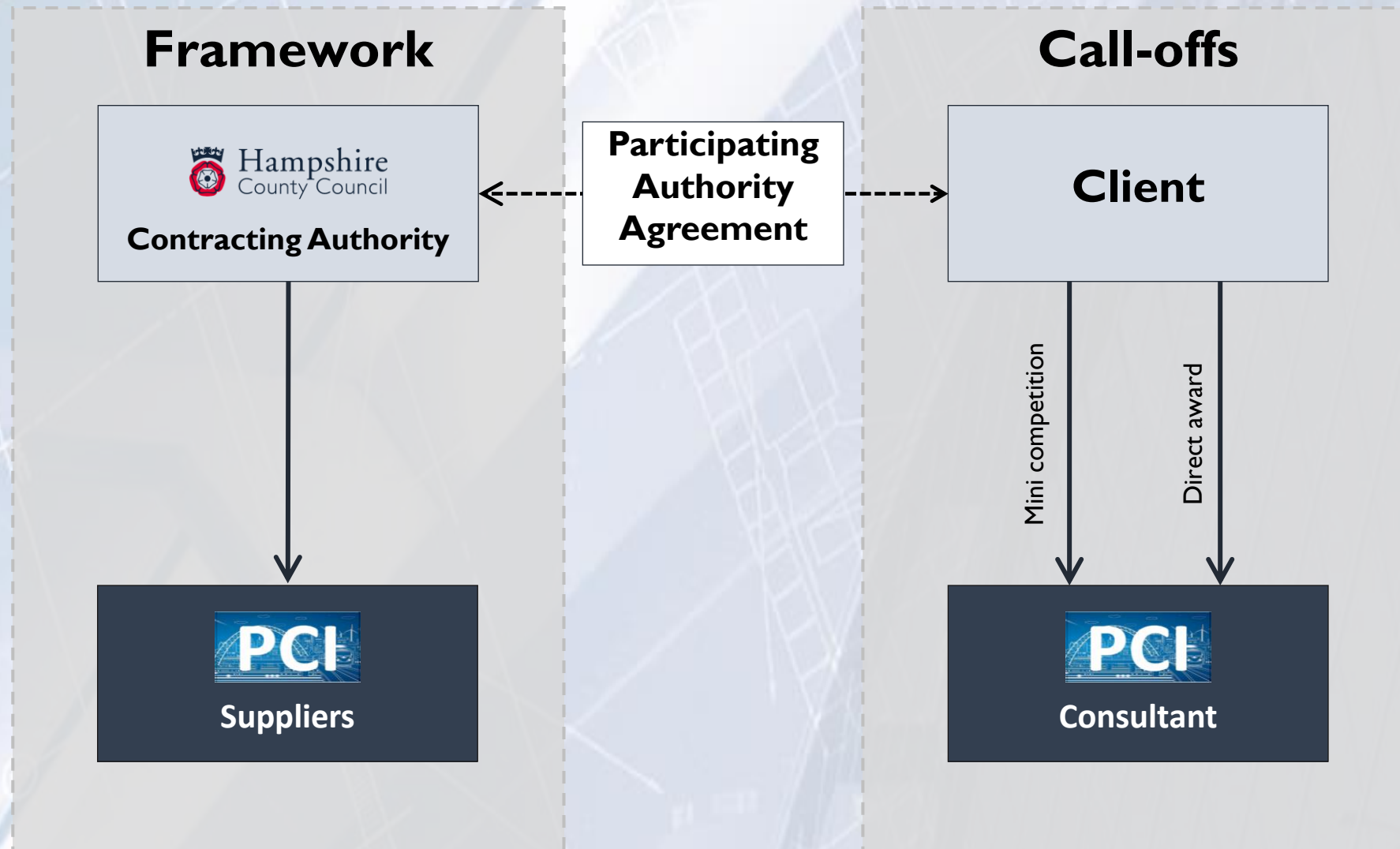
Measures how the Consultant is performing with regards to delivering the project, based around Time, Cost and Quality



Project Team Performance

Measures how the *Consultant's* project team (i.e. people) are performing.

Participating Authorities: Using the Framework



There are no fees to sign up to become a Framework user, and authorities will only have to sign a 'Participating Authority' agreement to access the Framework. This will be provided by Hampshire County Council. (HCC)

Once Participating Authorities award work through the Framework, HCC will invoice the Consultant for 1.75% of every invoice as a Framework Management fee. The Consultant will include this cost on every invoice to the Participating Authority.

The Participating Authorities can manage their procurement process in line with their organization's procedures.
